A brief update from Children's Speech & Language Therapy Services in Swindon



#### A FEW REMINDERS!

Referring to the Service: We operate an open referral system which means that we accept referrals from professionals (Health Visitors, GPs, Education staff etc) and also parents. We ask that evidence of a graduated response is provided. Information about making a referral can be found <a href="here">here</a>. We also provide advice and strategies about <a href="here">what you can do to support the child</a>. Referrals for children that there are concerns about at the pre-school stage are important. Don't wait until the child starts school as there is a lot that can be put in place to support then before then.

Waiting during interactions: Gives children extra time to process and respond and encourages them to respond. You are showing them how to have a turn. Look at this information from the Hanen centre: <a href="It's Worth the Wait">It's</a> Worth the Wait</a>

**Supporting families where English is an additional language:** We need to support parents and carers by giving consistent advice:

- It's important that parents use the language they know best and feel most comfortable in. This is how they can help children develop language.
- It's important to keep speaking the mother tongue at home. Children will understand what has been said and continue learning the language this way.
- There is no evidence that bilingualism will make it harder for children with language problems to develop speech and language.
- Share this "Words for life" information with parents.
