- There is also a <u>youtube channel</u> to support this, with videos to show you the signs that you need to use each day. click on the links above to find both.








Experts in child development have discovered that if a child knows eight nursery rhymes off by heart by the time they are 4 years old, they're usually among the best readers by the the time they are 8! Sing songs with a winter theme:

- Jingle Bells
- <u>Here we go round the mulberry bush</u>
- <u>I'm a little snowman</u>
- There's a snowflake on my nose
- <u>When Santa got stuck up the</u> <u>chimney</u>





Help children to learn and recall new words by introducing them like this:



Introduce this winter vocabulary by:

- The meaning of the word
- Describe the word
- Talk about how the word sounds
- Use the word in a sentence / make up a song
- Remember to note down the word and use it frequently / check to make sure it is remembered!

Winter Vocabulary

Did you know a child starting school will have an average vocabulary of around 5000 words. This means between the ages of one and five, children will learn around 3.5 words per day. Children need to hear a variety of different words to build sentences:

Concepts: melt/freeze, cold/hot Winter clothing : scarf, hat, gloves/mittens, boots, coat, jumper. Weather words: snow, rain, sleet, hail, ice, frozen, puddle, snowflake, Winter Nature: berries, buds, bulbs Action words: slip, slide, skate, de-ice, warm up, wrap up (warm), freezing, melting.



Winter communication board



We have included a Winter communication board in this edition. Communication boards benefit children who find it difficult to use spoken words by:

- Helping them to understand and process the word the adult has said by providing a visual support
- By slowing down the adult's rate of talking.

We show the child how they can use the communication board by pointing ourselves as we say the word/s. There is no expectation on the child to point. Communication boards are a great way of supporting a child's communication in a low pressure way.



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
