

## Activities to develop action words

- Action words should be introduced in the course of play or everyday domestic activity, if possible, as there is usually much repetition of the same words. For example, in a cooking situation there will be lots of opportunities for 'stir', 'mix', 'put', 'cut' etc.
- Similarly, when playing football you can use **'kick'**, **'throw'** frequently. You can model these verbs and then ask the child what you should do. E.g. 'Shall I **kick** the ball or **throw** the ball?'
- Sing action songs which use verbs, like 'Here we go round the mulberry bush' where you can use lots of verbs ('this is the way we ......')
- Play a simple version of Simon Says. The child can have a turn telling you what to do, by using picture prompts.
- Use large toys/dolls to play out actions, such as '**wash** teddy', 'make monkey **jump**' etc.
- Use gestures/signs to demonstrate verbs where possible.

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
