

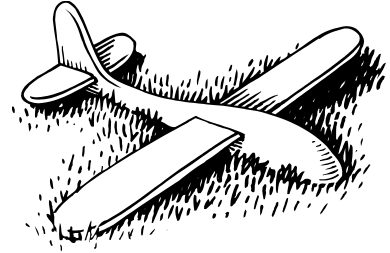
2 key word activities

A rough guide to knowing if your instruction contains 2 key words, is by checking that there is an alternative the child could choose for each word. Here are some 2 key word activities using everyday toys:

1. BODY PARTS

Use: 2 cuddly toys (teddy/rabbit)

Give instructions using the following format:
Where's teddy's/rabbit's ears/feet/tummy/face/arms



2. CHANGING PLACES

Use: 2 toys, 2 objects to put things on (table/chair/cushion/box)

Give instructions using the following format:
Put teddy/rabbit on the table/chair

3. ACTIVE TOYS

Use: 2 toy characters/animals

Give instructions using the following format:
Teddy/Rabbit is sleeping/jumping/walking/flying/sitting



4. CARE FOR THE TOYS

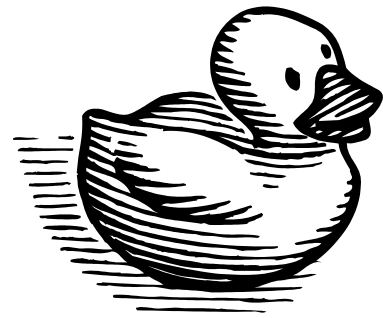
Use: 2 cuddly toys, brush, sponge

Give instructions using the following format:
Wash/brush/cuddle the teddy/rabbit

5. PASS THE TOYS

Use: any toys

Give instructions using the following format:
Give teddy/rabbit to mummy/daddy/Bob/Jane



Make the activities as fun as possible. Mix the instructions in with everyday play so that it doesn't seem like a test – let the child play with the toys you use first to familiarise themselves with the toys and the words you will use.
